Jeanne Bernick (Lenexa, KS) was raised on a cattle ranch in southern Missouri. After college, Jeanne moved to big city life, but ultimately returned to farms across America, listening to ag producers, their stories fueling her passion for connecting farmers with the right business resources to sustain the life they loved.



Over her 20-year career at Farm Journal Media, Jeanne became one of ag journalism's top editors, while developing relationships with generations of farm families. She grew Top Producer magazine into a leading industry brand, and established the Executive Women in Agriculture Conference. Currently Jeanne is a consultant working with large commercial producers at a food/ag industry accounting firm, KCoe Isom based in Kansas City.

Her morning presentation, *What Women in Ag Want*, will give us examples of farm women changing agriculture, tips on empowering, provoking both laughter and learning. Her after-lunch talk will highlight Jeanne's life experiences while in the journalism world and traveling the world.

Lisa McComb from Otsego County Economic Alliance, and **Rachel Frisch**, County Administrator, will give the "Welcome to Gaylord".

Ryan Kratochvil, GFCS Crop Insurance Specialist (Cadillac), will be on hand to discuss "Is Crop Insurance Worth It? Roller Coaster 2019 and Outlook 2020."

(Byron Center) will lead an
interactive segment before lunch
called "I Never Knew That About
You!" We will find common interests,
find others who may have
weathered similar storms, share
encouragement—all helping to
weave strands of friendship through
our group of wonderful women.

During Wednesday afternoon, **Ben** & Alison Sklarczyk

(Johannesburg) will come in and talk about their seed potato farm that grows ~6 million potatoes annually and ships all over the world. Alison, an owner and lab



manager who was named 2019 Spudwoman of the Year, will also lead a hands-on demonstration of tissue culture cutting. This will provide a timely lead-up to a more traditional potato farm we'll be touring on Thursday.



Wednesday we'll conclude with *Mindful Laughter* led by MSU Extension Health Educator **Tracie Abram** (St. Ignace). Interactive, fun-filled, and impactful, the sessions use mindfulness, or paying attention to the present moment without judgment, to help reduce worry, depression, and tension, while discovering the therapeutic benefits of laughter.

Triston Cole, State Representative for the 105th District (Mancelona), will give the legislative update on Friday morning. **Kate Pigott**, Intake/Outreach Coordinator, MI/FL Ag Mediation Programs (Lansing),

will lead a short course in Ag Mediation. For those experiencing turmoil and stress in their lives, Kate is a phone call away at 800-616-7863. She has several contacts who deal with specific issues. Ashley Messing-Kennedy (Bad Axe), blogger/farmer/young mom, will focus on Ag Promotion using social media, but also talk about transparency while dealing with depression and stress.



FWS was fortunate to be able to book Rachel's Challenge (home base in CO) to conclude our 2020 conference. Rachel Joy Scott was the first victim in the Columbine school shootings tragedy in 1999. Her parents found her journals which so inspired them that her father launched a national non-profit organization in her memory, dedicated to creating safe, connected school environments, where learning and teaching are maximized.

Although only some of us ladies are involved in education, many are moms or grandmothers, but ALL are community members—we can return home inspired with the knowledge that the concepts of Rachel's Challenge are available to make a difference in our own towns and cities. Alpine Maple Farms

Located smack in the middle of the 45th parallel, Gaylord is at the heart of Northern Michigan. With over 90 inland lakes and plentiful wildlife, Gaylord is an outdoor person's dream! The FWS Bus Tour committee has lined up a very diverse number of tour locations this year and you are in for a treat!

Kitchen Farms

One of our stops this year on the bus tour will be Kitchen Farms, in Elmira. The farm began in the early 1900's with Robert



Kitchen purchasing 80 acres, planting potatoes.



Today, both William (3rd generation) and Donald (4th generation) own and operate over 5000 acres. They utilize controlled temperatures to store potatoes and we will be taking a

tour of their storage and packing facility. They also have a retail store that offers bags of potatoes for sale.

Gaylord's City Elk Park

The city of Gaylord maintains an elk herd of approximately 70 Elk, on over 100 acres.

City staff feed the elk corn, hay, sugar beets as well as vitamins. A few of the bulls weigh over 800 pounds and stand approximately six feet tall. If we are lucky, the bulls will still be



donning their massive horns when we visit the Elk Park next March.



Big Buck Brewery

Our lunch stop of the day will be Big Buck Brewery and we will be able to take a short tour while there. In 2018, the brewery was rebranded, featuring a focus on Michigan-made products.

The food is amazing and they are known for their black-cherry house-made soda.

Owners Jordan and Amanda Hunt have maple syrup running in their blood. After years of making syrup on a large scale with their family for six years, they decided to open their own "sugar bush." Located on over 40 acres, they offer not only a full array of maple syrup products, but also snowshoeing on groomed trails as well as tours. We are excited to be able to tour their facility and taste the sweet syrup made from trees.

Alpine Chocolat Haus



Bruce Brown, also known as "Der Chocolatmeister" to many in the Gaylord community, will be taking us on a tour of his facility and what he calls "confectionery magic." Alpine Chocolat Haus has been in business since 1985 and particularly is known for their chocolate covered potato chips, fine chocolates and white chocolate covered caramel corn, mixed with peanut butter.

In addition to the tour, we will also be visiting his retail

store in the downtown area, as well as providing additional time to shop some of the fine stores in the down town area.
